

In Memoriam

We are all deeply saddened to hear that Past District One Director, Mike Linkovich, passed away Sunday December 4, 2022 at the age of 100. "Link" touched innumerable athletic trainers' and students' lives during his lifetime and we are all thankful for the time we got to spend in his presence. Link enrolled in Springfield College, earning a master's degree in physical education in 1954. He moved to Brunswick and served as the head athletic trainer at Bowdoin College, retiring in 1994 after more than 40 years with the school. Despite the numerous achievements and accolades he received throughout his life, Mike remained a man of great humility. He was inducted into the National Athletic Trainers' Association (NATA) Hall of Fame (1982), Beaver County (Pennsylvania) Sports Hall of Fame (1983), Davis & Elkins College Athletic Hall of Fame (1993), the Maine Baseball Hall



of Fame (2000), and the Bowdoin College Athletic Hall of Honor (2004) and the EATA '49 Club's inaugural class in 2017. He was the recipient of the Bowdoin College Alumni Council Award for Faculty and Staff in 1980, given for outstanding service and devotion to Bowdoin College. He was appointed a director of NATA in 1961, representing the New England states. He was elected Vice President (1969) and President (1970) of the Eastern Athletic Trainers' Association. A pinnacle of his career was serving as an athletic trainer for the "Miracle on Ice" U.S. Hockey Team at the 1980 Winter Olympic Games in Lake Placid, N.Y. He was also appointed as a trainer for the 1980 Moscow Summer Olympics.

President Matt Whalen, MS, LAT, ATC

ATOM has spent the last few months focused on the continued sustained growth of our organization. We have emphasized strengthening the financial wellbeing, legislative initiatives, and scholarship funding. Legislatively the bills related to the practice of athletic training failed to make it to the Governor's desk.

The bills we had in play this legislative cycle(HD.2666, HD.1811, HD.2320) were sent to committee. An attempt was made by our lobbyist and GAC to add an amendment to H.5007. Unfortunately, this attempt to get passage that would update our practice act was eliminated from that bill. Bob Colandreo, Government Affairs Committee Chair, will be analyzing the shortcomings and the recent election results with our lobbyist group, Tremont Strategies in the new year to set forth a new plan. We will continue to fight for the rights of athletic trainers' fair practice in Massachusetts.

Financially, Jenn Concannon, President-Elect and Jordan Knight, Treasurer, spent time with our financial advisors to evaluate ways to improve the strength of our organization. We want to ensure the continued financial strength of the organization with the reduction of grants, inflation, and down markets. During the evaluation we are looking into consolidating accounts that were generate minimal growth into an account that will provide more interest. The financial decisions are always done with the best interests of the membership at the forefront.

A continued effort of the organization is to promote and support the future leaders of the profession. In 2020, the organization made the executive decision to increase the ATOM scholarship amount to \$2,500, however, we would like to continue to raise this amount and provide additional means to support students pursuing a career in athletic training. The committee has worked to plan a capital campaign to endow an educational scholarship with a goal of \$25,000. The executive council announced its first step in this capital campaign which will be a fundraiser during the annual EATA in January 2023. The "Fuel the Future" fundraiser will be hosted at Harpoon Brewery in Boston, MA on Friday, January 6th. CLICK HERE to purchase tickets. Hello all, I hope the conclusion of your fall season and transition to the winter season has been largely uneventful. There has been much discussion about the number of athletic training job openings in CT including articles in the Waterbury Republican and the Danbury New-Times. The CATA in conjunction with the CIAC is trying to determine the extent of the issue in secondary

schools. We ask all secondary school athletic trainers to be sure to update their information within the ATLAS project. Check your school status HERE and update your information HERE and to remind their ADs to complete the short survey distributed by the CIAC.

Jessica Testani Creem, Heather Feiner, and Mark Aceto of the Secondary School Committee presented at the Connecticut Associate of Athletic Director annual conference. The presentation was focused on using the NATA Value Model to support hiring athletic trainers in the secondary school. We are exploring the best ways to share this with school superintendents. This information will be available at secondary schools' regional meetings which will start shortly.

At our state meeting in January at the EATA conference, the Executive Committee will be presenting a proposed change to the association by-laws that will update the committee structure of our organization. We think these changes will streamline activities and provide more opportunity for members to "try out" volunteer opportunities in CATA in positions that may have time commitments that better match your availability. A draft of the proposal will be distributed via e-blast to allow you to review ahead the meeting. There are multiple opportunities to get involved in the CATA. The diversity of skills and experiences in our membership has driven our success as an organization. What role will you play?







President John Ryan, EdD, LAT, ATC, RAA

The MATA Executive Board has met on and off since the Northern New England Athletic Trainers Conference to further revise the MATA Bylaws for the purpose of tightening up language, extend the onboarding time for all Executive Board positions to 6 months and eliminate the vote of affirmation when there is only one eligible candidate running for an Executive Board position. The revised bylaws were submitted to the membership in October for review and comment and voted on in early November. The membership overwhelmingly approved the revisions.

A call for nominations for MATA President and Vice President was issued in late August/early September. MATA President, John Ryan has termed out and Paul Culina was eligible to run for another term as Vice President. At the end of the nominations period, Paul Culina and Sherrie Weeks were the only eligible candidates to run for President and Vice President. A vote of affirmation was completed at the MATA Fall Meeting, with Paul Culina affirmed as President and Sherrie Weeks as Vice President.

The MATA held its annual fall meeting virtually on November 18th. A moment of silence was observed for Aaron Marston who passed away suddenly on October 19th. Aaron was the women's soccer coach and Associate Professor of Exercise Science at the University of Maine at Presque Isle. Aaron leaves behind his wife, Keli and two beautiful daughters, Taylor and Kaci. D1 Director-Elect Vicky Graham was present and provided opening remarks. Following those remarks, the business portion of the meeting was held. The results of the vote on the revised MATA Bylaws were announced by MATA Secretary, Chris Rizzo, with the vote in favor of the revised bylaws. This was followed by the Secretary, Treasurer and various Committee Reports. Katie Stephenson of MCMI gave a brief report about the HIT app, and that was followed by a report from outgoing MATA President, John Ryan on the NATAPAC and its fundraiser at the 2023 EATA Convention and the NATA State Association Advisory Committee. After a short break, Dr. Alicia Lacy of the University of Maine and Dr. Christianne Eason of UCONN/KSI presented on Stakeholders' Perceptions and Knowledge of Athletic Training.

This wraps up a whirlwind four years as your MATA President. It has been an honor and a privilege representing the athletic trainers not only from the state of Maine but of District 1. I will not be going too far however. I will continue to represent and work for the membership of the MATA and D1 as the District 1 Rep on the NATAPAC and as one of the two Division 1 Reps on the NATA SAAC. I will also continue to do whatever is asked by the MATA. Additionally, I will be assuming the position of EATA President-Elect in January and look forward to another tremendous opportunity to not only represent Maine, but District 1 as well.

Thank you to those that I have been fortunate to have worked with these past four years on the MATA Executive Board. Thank you to Diane, Vicky, Julie Alexander, Jenn Brodeur, Sandy Snow, the other New England State Association Presidents. You are not only colleagues but have become some of my closest friends.

EDAC has been working hard since the NATA symposium in Atlanta this past June which was a great success!

We hosted a Town Hall, Service Project, and again participated in Be The Match for the National Bone Marrow Registry. We are also hard at work developing Bystander Training for the NATA as well as updating our Diversity in Leadership report to be presented at NATA Symposium 2023. The last time we published this information was in 2017, so we are excited to see how the profession has evolved in that time. In addition to presenting the data we have collected, we are assembling an excellent panel of diverse athletic trainers to discuss actionable items to improve diversity in the profession and to take questions from attendees. Our EDAC 365 campaign is coming to an end, where we have posted daily on social media regarding topics relevant to diversity in athletic training for the entirety of 2022. We are currently seeking applicants for the Bill Chisolm Professional Service Award, presented annually to an individual who has contributed to the development and enhancement of ethnically diverse athletic trainers. Applications are due February 1st, application information can be found on the EDAC page on the NATA website.



NATA GAC Update Jim Murdock, MEd, ATC District One Chair

The Governmental Affairs Committee (GAC) has updated the grant application process. The intent of the new application

process is to better educate the states in the process and requirements for the grant monies and to further enhance the documentation of the need and tracking of the funding.

Our hope is to make the ability for states applying for funding more invested in their responsibility for their fundraising and shared fiscal accountability. The new process involves each state creating it own Legislative Action Plan with a subsequent After-Action document. The states have just submitted their action plans and the GAC will be reviewing them. The release of this new application and process however does not come with any funding. The GAC is still awaiting the NATA BOD for its approval to release funding. We as well as the states had hoped funding would have been available for the 2023 cycle. The purpose for this approach is to have all parties involved prepared to start the allocation of funds as son as they are available.

The GAC has continued to assist states in the following areas:

- 1. Legislative educational process and procedures
- 2. Enhanced efforts for obtaining financial resources (fundraising, donor support)
- Educational outreach to existing NATA Governmental Affairs resources (data information, software programs and other outreach collaboration)
- 4. Educational resources to enhance advocacy and informational outreach.
- 5. A concerted effort and plan to re-evaluate the function and goals of the NATA GAC.

The GAC is committed to support states in their legislative efforts and ways to advance and protect the Athletic Training professional.



ICSM Update Dan Davies, ATC District One Chair NCAA D-I At-large

As an advocate for collegiate athletes and athletic trainers, the Intercollegiate Council for Sports Medicine works to create resources

for those practicing in this setting. The ICSM would like to thank all the athletic trainers who have worked extremely hard over the past year continuing to support athletes in an ever-changing collegiate landscape. We also extend our congratulations to Erin Variano, Brown University who has been selected as the new Ivy League representative to the ICSM.

We would also like to remind you of the numerous resources available from the ICSM. View Resources Here.

As we head toward the end of our fall semesters, I want to give everyone an update on some of the ICSM projects.

- 1. The ICSM has been collaborating with the Collegiate Group of the Compensation Task Force over the past year. Our past survey and collaborative work is leading to an upcoming resource addressing the current Collegiate Athletic Trainer Landscape. On that note, if you have not viewed any of the Compensation Podcasts, I recommend you do. They've been very good so far.
- 2. The Best Practices for Development of a Bias Action Plan materials are now on the ICSM Resource page. We are currently organizing a Town Hall on this topic for some time in December or January.
- 3. Another project that crossed over from last spring and includes current and past ICSM is the Professional Management and Advancement Best Practices for the Collegiate Athletic Trainer which can be found on the ICSM resource page. This has been introduced to both Chair of the NATA's Career Advancement Committee and Chair of

the Young Professionals. Their committees are very supportive of the resource, and we are in the process of scheduling a meeting for December to see how we can collaborate with this further.

- 4. Monkey Pox infographic was quickly created in response to the NCAA's Health Care Administrator communication to provide education to student-athletes, coaches and administrators.
- 5. 2023 NATA symposia presentation has been approved. Beyond the Athletic Training Room: Administration 101" Theme: Recruit, Retain, Integrate and Develop Emerging Athletic Trainers Administrative Responsibilities
- 6. NATA liaison to the NCAA's Mental Health Task Force has been approved. The overall goal of the Task Force is to update/revise the current NCAA Mental Health Best Practice Document.
- 7. Currently finishing up interviews and selection process for new members. Will be finalizing the open seats currently available after the Thanksgiving holiday. 
